This list omits species absent from all four recording areas, very obscure aliens/casuals and subspecies

Species in italics are not native (neophytes) to the country according to *New Atlas of the British and Irish Flora* (Preston, Pearman, Dines. OUP, 2002)

Archaeophytes have been treated as if native (eg. *Aegopodium*, *Foeniculum*, *Smyrniolum olusatrum*)

Many aliens are non-persistent casuals from bird seed, escapes from cultivation etc
